

Discredit	TO DISHONOR; DISGRACE; CAUSE TO BE DOUBTED
Disengaged	freed from an engagement, pledge, or obligation
Disinterested	free of bias or self-interest; impartial
Dismissive	Showing indifference or disregard
Disparage	to degrade, to speak of someone or something in a derogatory manner
Disparity	An inequality; a gap; an imbalance
Dispassionate	(adj.) impartial; calm, free from emotion
Dubious	(adj) doubtful, questionable, suspect
Earnest	Serious in intention or purpose; showing depth and SINCERITY of feelings
Elicit	(v.) to draw forth, bring out from some source (such as another person)

Endorse	give support or one's approval to
Equivocal	Open to two or more interpretations and often intended to mislead; ambiguous
Exemplify	To illustrate by being an example of
Hyperbole	A figure of speech that uses exaggeration to express strong emotion, make a point, or evoke humor
Hypothesis	A testable prediction, often implied by a theory
Illustrate	1. To provide a book or periodical with pictures. 2. To make clear by using examples, charts, etc.
Indifferent	having no interest or concern, apathetic; showing no bias or prejudice
Interpret	A technique used to explore the meanings of free association, dreams, resistances, and transference feelings.
Ironic	Satiric; unexpected
Justify	Give valid reasons or evidence to support an answer or conclusion.
