**Monday:**

1) Discuss the Novel (Chapters 22-26)! **Chapter 22:** Atticus tells Jem, "It's not time to worry yet . . . We're not through yet. There'll be an appeal, you can count on that" (285). And, Bob Ewell's threat!

**Chapter 23:** Atticus's calm demeanor. (291); Jem's frustration with the legal system (294) and (296); Jem is shocked to discover that one juror wanted an "acquittal" (297); Aunt Alexandra's prejudice flares! (301) Kinds of Folks! (302) Jem says there are 4 kinds. Scout disagrees!

**Chapter 24:** Aunt Alexandra's Missionary Circle; Mrs. Merriweather's report - J. Grimes Everett and the poor Mrunas; (310-312) The discussion takes a turn. Miss Maudie gets upset! (312) "His food doesn't stick going down, does it?"; (315) Oh No! Tom!; Be a lady.

**Chapter 25:** The news to Helen (322); Mr. Underwood's Editorial (323) "He likened Tom's death to the senseless slaughter of mockingbirds by hunters and children."

**Chapter 26:** School started (Jem = 7th grader at the High School, Scout a 3rd grader); Radleys and Tom Robinson's memory (326); Miss Gates and Current Events (329); (331) Scout remembers what Miss Gates had said on the courthouse steps!; Jem's craze! (331).
